5. RANK ADVANCEMENT AND MERIT BADGES...

Troop 112 concentrates on developing basic skills and encouraging ownership personal ownership in the boy's scouting experience. Therefore, all Scouts are reminded that newer Scouts should be focused on rank advancement and Basic Skills through participation. Because of this, Troop 112 Merit Badges are only offered to those Scouts who are First Class and above. However, there may be special occasions when junior Scouts will be offered Merit Badge opportunities. Still, Merit Badges are only worn by Scouts who are First Class and above. Exception: Any Troop 112 Scout, regardless of rank, may earn Merit Badges at summer camp. Remember: Troop 112 only accepts "required" Merit Badges that are taken from our own troop counselors.
