- C. All Scouts and Adults are required to complete a BSA Medical (parts A&B).
- D. All Camp-Outs will again be just \$20 for the Scout....Free for Adults.
- E. All Adults driving their personal vehicles must complete a Vehicle Insurance form.

- F. Your Scouting Ten Essentials are required for EVERY camp-out.
